

Countable and uncountable nouns

There are two types of nouns: countable nouns and uncountable nouns

1/ Uncountable nouns : are used in the following ways :

*uncountable nouns are the things can't be counted as one, two , three...

Eg: milk / water/ money

*uncountable nouns are the names of materials, liquids and other things which we do n't see as a separate object

Eg: wood/ metal / silver

*Activities and sports

Eg: running / tennis / shopping

*names of subjects

Eg History / Physics

*Languages

Eg: Russian / English / French / Arabic

*We can't use the articles (a/ an) or numbers with uncountable nouns

Eg : weather / air / gold

*Before the uncountable noun we can use (the / some /any / much / this / his)

Eg: the music / some gold

*We can 't use the articles (a / an) or numbers with uncountable nouns but we can say :

-twenty literes of petrol.

-a peics of wood.

-a peics / a slice of bread.
