

## 1 SYLLABLE WORD

A one syllable word is NEVER divided. It has one or more letters but one vowel sound (beat), and is produced by a single voice impulse.

## COMPOUND WORD

A compound word is divided between the words that make it a compound word:

base/ball cow/boy sun/set



## VCCV

When two or more consonants come between two vowels, the word is usually divided between the first two consonants:

vc/cv vc/ccv
bet/ter pic/ture ath/lete
shot/gun for/got in/spect
whip/lash en/trench spend/thrift



When a single consonant comes between two vowels in a word, the word is usually divided before the consonant and the first vowel is long.

mu/sic po/lite pa/per lo/cate

## DIVISION PROCESS

- Cross off silent e (if there is one at the end)
- Mark the vowels (v)
- Mark the consonants between the vowels ©
- Determine correct syllable pattern
- Divide
- Identify syllable types/vowel condition
- Pronounce each syllable and blend the word
- Have you divided correctly? Are there other possibilities? If yes, start over



When a word has a prefix and/or suffix, the word is divided between the affix and the root
