The pronunciation of the final "s" and "ed"

1. The pronunciation of the final "s": The pronunciation of the final S in plural words and verbs in the third person depend on the final consonant sound before that S.

This can be illustrated in the following table.

2. The pronunciation of the final "ed": There are three different pronunciations of the –ed ending for regular past tense verbs. The pronunciation of the –ed ending depends on the final sound in the verb:
