# **Video Game Ratings**

Video and computer games are popular among people of all ages. About 67% of Americans play video games on at least one device including video game consoles, computers, tablets, or smart phones. Children play video games on average about two hours a day.

The content of today's video and computer games varies widely. Games have information about the content that can help buyers and players decide whether a particular game is suitable for purchasing, downloading, or playing for free online.

The Entertainment Software Rating Board maintains a two-part rating system for video and computer games. First, is the lettered rating symbol, such as E or M. The letter suggests the game's age appropriateness. Second are the content descriptors, such as "intense violence," which point out specific elements of the game that have caused the rating and that may be of concern.

Players can change the content of a rated game by downloading software from the Internet onto their computers. These programs, called "mods," can make a game's content more explicit than the rating indicates. This in turn, could make the game inappropriate for players like kids and teens.

Games rated AO (Adult Only) have content that is suitable only for people 18 and older. These games may include, "prolonged scenes of intense violence." Games rated M (mature) "have content that may be suitable for people over 17, and may contain, "intense violence, blood and gore, and strong language."

Games rated T (Teen) have content that may be suitable for kids over 13. They may contain, "violence, suggestive themes, crude humor, minimal blood, and the use of strong language." Games rated E10+ (Everyone 10 and older) have content that may be suitable for kids at least 10. These games may contain, "more cartoon, fantasy, or mild violence, mild language, and/or minimal suggestive themes."

An E (Everyone) rating is found on games that have content that may be suitable for kids at least six years of age. Games rated EC (Early Childhood) are intended for preschoolers who are at least three years old. The games with an EC rating contain no material that parents would find inappropriate.

# Using apostrophes to show possession

# **Apostrophes**

An apostrophe shows that one thing belongs to another. To make a singular noun possessive, add an apostrophe + s.

Bill's bicycle

To make a regular plural noun possessive, add an apostrophe after the letter s.

the kids' bicycles

Do not use an apostrophe to show that a noun is plural.

# **Possessive Pronouns**

Pronouns, such as him, her, they, and them are stand-ins for proper nouns; in other words, they refer to someone or something specific without using the proper noun or name. **Possessive pronouns show ownership.** Some are used alone, while others are used to modify or describe a noun.

**Used alone**: mine, yours, his, hers, ours, theirs, whose

**EXAMPLE**: That computer is **hers**. That car is **mine**.

**Used as modifier**: my, your, his, her, its, ours, their, whose

**EXAMPLE**: That is **her** computer. The car needs **its** clutch replaced.

\*Note that **none** of the possessive pronouns uses an apostrophe to show ownership. Pay extra attention to your use of possessive pronouns, as several of them sound like some commonlyused contractions. For example, watch your use of the following commonly confused their/they're, possessive pronouns and contractions: Your/you're, its/its, and Whose/Who's.

#### Ramadan

Islam is one of the most widespread religions in the world. Its followers number 1.8 billion. Islam is practiced in many countries throughout the world. Islam is based on the belief in one God, Allah. Allah is the Arabic word Muslims use for "God."

In Arabic, "Islam" means submission to Allah. Muslims believe that in the seventh century Allah chose Muhammad Peace Be Upon Him to receive his message. Muhammad Peace Be Upon Him recorded the revelations he received. That text came to be known as the Quran.

The most important rituals practiced by the Muslims are often referred to as the Five Pillars of Islam. They are as follows:

- 1. Shahadah—a short statement declaring the greatness and oneness of Allah.
- 2. Salat—prayer that is offered five times a day.
- 3. Sawm—the fast that takes place during Ramadan.
- 4. Zakat—a religious tax used for the poor, the sick, and the others less privileged in the Islamic community.
- 5. Hajj—the pilgrimage to the Holy City of Mecca.

The third pillar references an important Muslim holiday. Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar and begins with the coming of the crescent moon. This month lasts 29 or 30 days and occurs during different seasons depending on the cycle of the calendar. The fast of Ramadan lasts the entire month. All those who have reached the age of puberty (usually 12 years of age) are expected to observe the fast.

During this time, strict restraints are placed on Muslims. They are not to eat or drink during the daylight hours. Smoking and sexual relations are also forbidden. The fast is broken at sunset. It begins again the next morning when one can see the white light coming through the darkness.

Ramadan is a time for Muslims to concentrate on the practice of their faith. It is a time for greater focus on Islam and less focus on everyday concerns. Time is spent praying, worshipping, contemplating, and receiving religious instruction. Part of the worship includes reciting passages from the Quran.

For many, Ramadan is a time of profound joy. There is a festive atmosphere after sunset. In many cities, Muslims visit with family and friends after they have broken the fast. Shopping areas and restaurants are busy, alive with food and fellowship.

On the 27th day of Ramadan, fireworks are often used to celebrate the Night of Power. The Night of Power is the night that Muhammad Peace Be Upon Him first received his revelation of the Quran in the year 610. Ramadan is a time to celebrate and give thanks for the gift of the

Quran. It is a time to remember the poor, to practice self-discipline, and recommit one's self to the Islamic faith.
